Interesting Facts from SSA's National Beneficiary Survey (NBS)

Reasons SSA beneficiaries with disabilities reported for not working in 2004

- While more than 9 out of 10 SSA beneficiaries were not working in 2004 due to their physical/ mental condition, SSI beneficiaries were more likely than SSDI beneficiaries to say they were not working for reasons other than their physical and/or mental condition.
- SSI beneficiaries (24%) were almost twice as likely as SSDI (13%) beneficiaries to report transportation problems as a reason for not working.
- Only 11% of all SSA beneficiaries stated they were not working because they did not want to lose their benefits.
 - ♦ A greater percentage of SSI beneficiaries (14%) stated they did not work because they did not want to lose their benefits compared to 9% of SSDI beneficiaries.
